



The following directives for TCSA District 10 will be in place for the duration of the Indoor 2020-21 season

(in effect August 28, 2020)

TCSA Indoor 2020-21 Directives

- Tri-County District Association (TCSA) will remain under ASA Phase 2 Return to Play Guidelines for the duration on the 2020-21 season (unless otherwise communicated by Alberta Soccer Association (ASA) or Alberta Health (AHS).
- Any changes to ASA, AHS, or local authority guidelines or policy are considered to be immediately in effect upon declaration.
 - District activities are subject at all times to guidelines/policies enacted by local (municipal/county) authorities.
- District activities may be suspended at any time at the discretion of the District Executive.
- District members exhibiting COVID symptoms must comply with ASA Phase 2 Appendix 11 - Declaration of Compliance - COVID.

Internal District Activity

- There will be no District leagues hosted during the 2020-21 Indoor Season.
 - Clubs may not conduct inter club practices, scrimmages, or 'friendlies'.
- Clubs may chose to host in-house activities (where facilities and local authority permits) in the club's community area
- Clubs may not host in-house activities outside their established community area (fields or facilities) or outside the district boundaries in out-of-district facilities.

Technical Activity

- Non-ASA sanctioned technical staff (or entities) may not conduct activity with District members within District boundaries.
- Out of District technical staff (or entities) may only interact with district teams (operating out of district) where prior approval has been given by the District executive. Full names of these individuals and their affiliations must be submitted to the District for review/approval prior to any activity taking place with District members.
- Only ASA sanctioned technical staff (or entities) may perform activities with in-district (in house) club teams.

- Full names of these individuals and their affiliations must be submitted to the District for review/approval prior to any activity taking place with in district members.
- any infraction of the above directives may result in immediate suspension of Club activities indefinitely, subject to review by the District Executive. Club representatives or team officials involved in infractions of this activity will be subject to indefinite suspension.

Out of District Club Activity

Clubs may declare teams outside the District into sport cohorts/leagues subject to the following conditions:

- Out of District activity sanctioned by TCSA will be at the discretion of the district involved or local government authority thereof.
 - Out of District teams will be subject to all league policies and commitments of the districts in which they participate
- Clubs with an out of District team/cohort are not permitted to conduct activities (games, scrimmages, practices) for these cohorts at any time within the District boundaries if the facility hosts activities for an in-district sport cohort.
 - In house and out of district teams must use separate facilities throughout the duration of the season
- Out of district cohort members may not combine in any sport activity with an in-district cohort

District Cohort Guidelines

- Members may not participate in any additional sport activities outside their selected sport cohort.
- There will be NO combined practices between separate cohorts
- Coaches/team officials may not participate with any another cohort outside the cohort they are embedded.
- coaches may re-embed in another cohort if they have served the requisite 14 day quarantine period
- Members may not be added or changed between any cohort without first serving a 14 day quarantine period.
- any member changing cohorts must be submitted to the district with their first/last days of quarantine listed
- if entire cohorts are being reformed (e.g. because of reforming cohorts for league play), each new cohort list must be submitted to the District with the first/last day of quarantine period included for each member of the cohort
- Trialists are not permitted
- Members declared to internal district or out of district sport cohorts may not participate with non-sanctioned individuals in a sport activity without complying with social distancing guidelines

- the intent is to maintain both the health, safety, and integrity of cohort members performing in their sanctioned activities AND also the health and safety of the non-sanctioned individuals

Season Suspension or Cancellation

- During the 2020-21 season, we do not wish to punish any member who chooses to participate in District activity in good faith but, for any reason, decides to subsequently withdraw from activity. Should less than 50% of the indoor season take place prior to a suspension of District activity, members should be offered a pro-rated refund by the club from the time of the request for withdrawal.
- If more than 50% of the season takes place, clubs may offer a refund to those individuals who still wish to withdraw at their own discretion.
This directive is to establish a consistent District threshold for refunds due to suspension applied and does not abrogate individual club refund policy.

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
